
## **Chapter 9 - A New National Identity**

**2.** Series of measures developed by Henry Clay meant to make the U.S. economically self-sufficient.

- Lake Erie and New York City much easier than before; construction began in 1817.
- **4.** A revolutionary fighter in Latin America; was nicknamed 'THE LIBERATOR'.
- **5.** First road built by the federal government, which ran from Cumberland, MD to Wheeling, WV; construction on it began in 1815.
- 7. Ended the War of 1812.
- **9.** Disagreements between the different regions of the country and the people that make up those regions.
- **11.** An agreement between the U.S. and Great Britain that settled fishing rights and established new North American borders.
- **13.** Painted the portrait entitled 'Fur Traders Descending the Missouri'.
- **14.** (1817) Agreement that limited naval power on the Great Lakes for both the U.S. and Great Britain.
- **18.** Artists at this school, which was established in the 1830s, created paintings that reflected national pride and an appreciation of the American landscape.
- **19.** An era of peace, pride, and progress that took place in America from 1815 to 1825; emphasis was national unity.
- **20.** Was fascinated by stories of the west and Native Americans; wrote the books 'The Pioneers' and 'The Last of the Mohicans'.
- **21.** Settled the conflict that arose when Missouri applied for statehood in 1819; create 2 new states and banned slavery north of 36 30 latitude.
- **22.** (1819) Treaty signed between the U.S. and Spain which settled all border disputes between the two countries; America got the rest of Florida from Spain.
- **23.** When people have feelings of pride and loyalty to a nation.

- **6.** U.S. representative, Senator, and presidential contender; developed a plan for our nation's economic growth called the American System.
- **8.** Was born in 1783; wrote the books 'Rip Van Winkle' and 'The Legend of Sleepy Hollow'.
- **10.** Group that choose the winner of the election of 1824; were required by the Constitution do choose the winner.
- **12.** An exclusive statement of American foreign policy warning European powers not to interfere with the Americas; has 4 parts to it.
- 15. State that entered the union as a free state in 1820.
- **16.** Founder of the Hudson River School; was a landscape painter.
- **17.** Won the election of 1824 by making a 'corrupt bargain' with Henry Clay.
