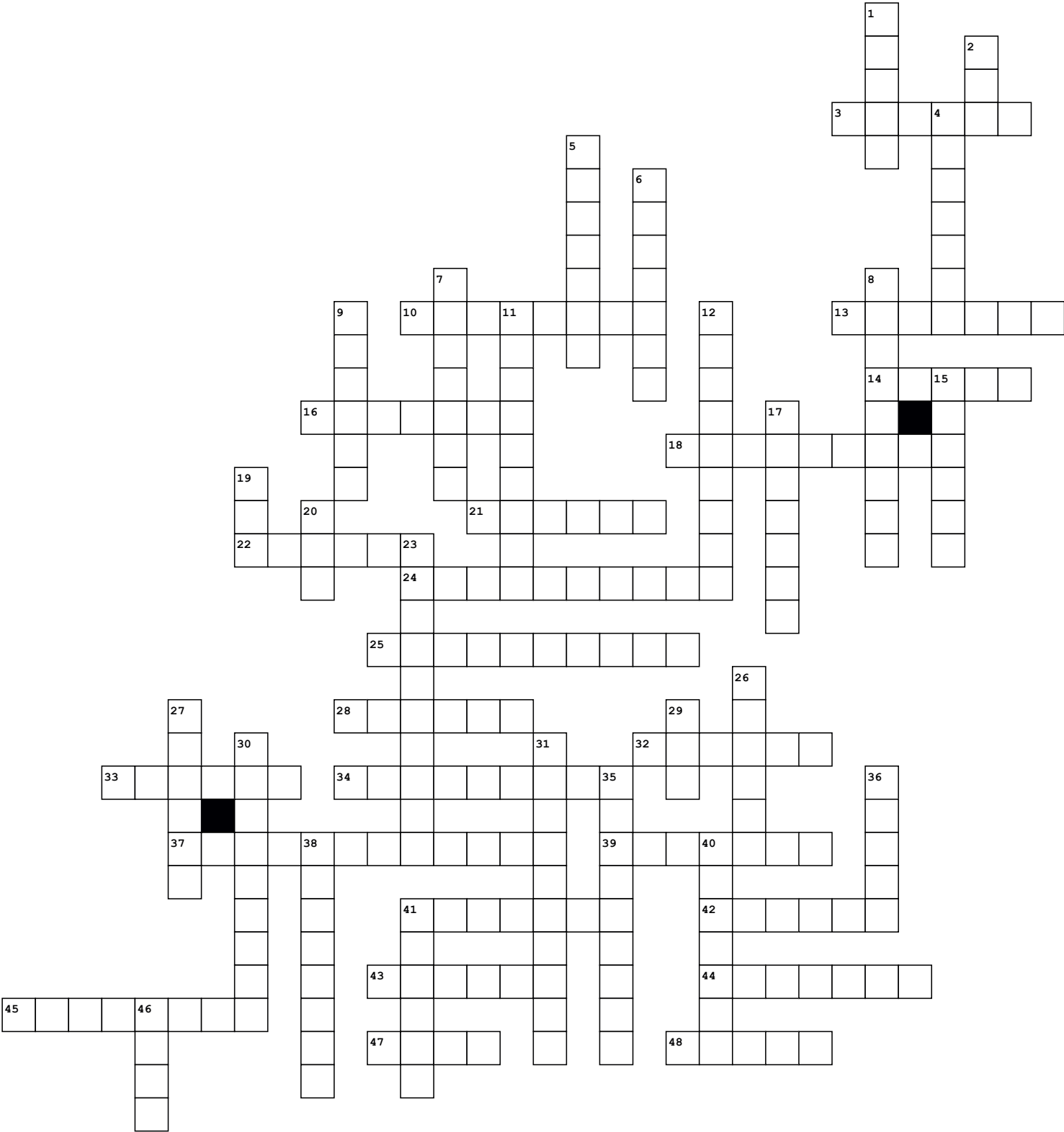


# Great Expectations Crossword Puzzle
