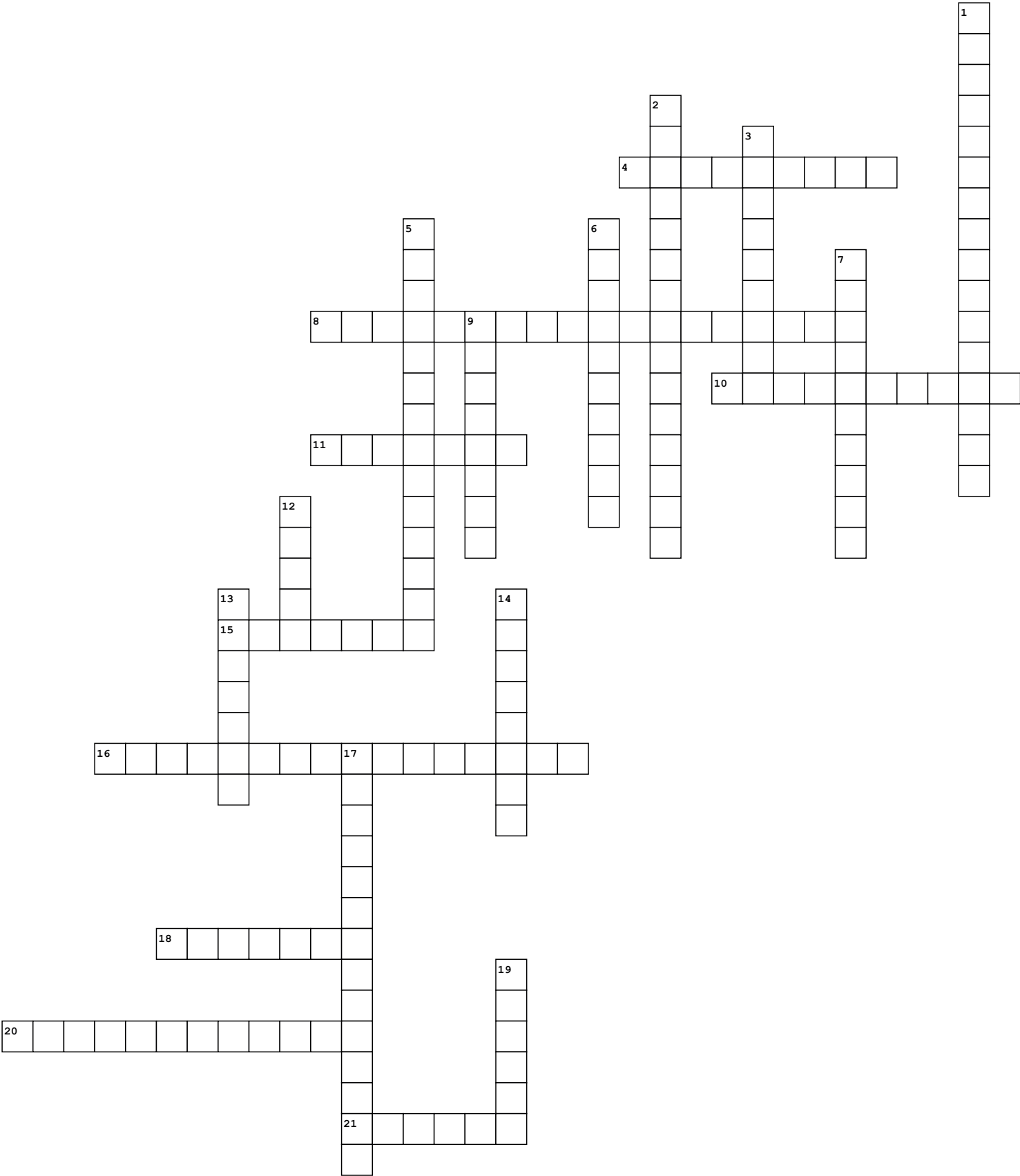


Gothic Vocabulary
