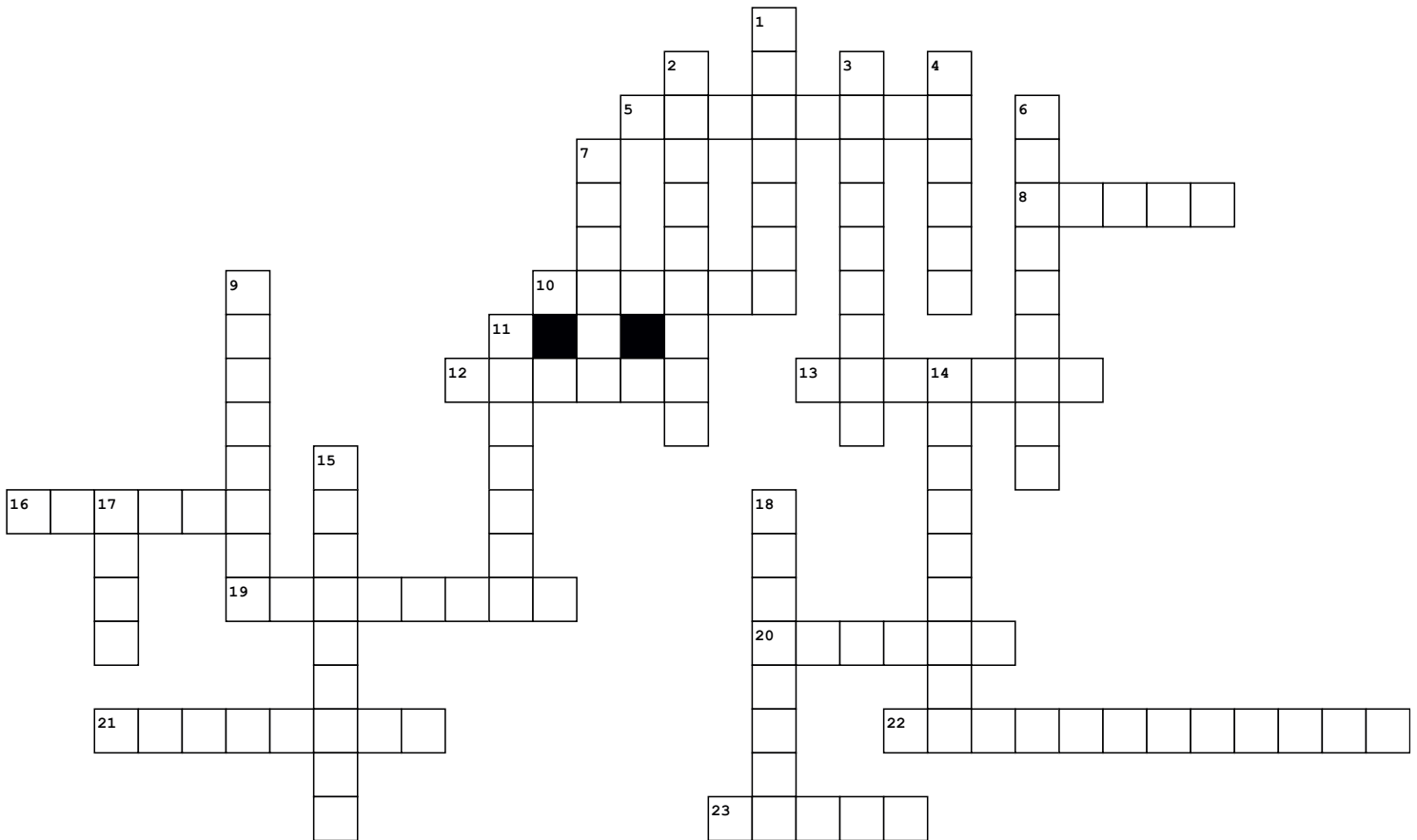


# Journalism terms

5. Short statement that grabs the reader's attention, summarizes important information in the story; found at the begging of a story and is usually in large type

13. Use of lines,screen,boxes,and large first letters to break up areas of space on the page

20. Short headline text or visuals that highlight articles in the interior of the paper

1. Brief story with a special angle that goes with a main story
2. Articles that includes information about an event that is recent and relevant to people's lives
3. One written by a reporter working for a news service
4. A report that evaluates a restaurant, book, movie, music album or other entertainment
6. An article, usually featured on the editorial page, where the newspaper, its management or staff, or readers express their opinion and encourages certain action
7. Vertical division of the page that helps to give it structure. Newspaper stories and images are measured in column inches-the number of columns wide by inches long
9. Formal statement of the newspaper's name, officer, management of place and publication, usually found on the editorial page

**14.** A quote from the news story that is separated and emphasized using special fonts and graphics

**15.** Statement made by a person other than the author and included in the story either using the person's exact words in quotations or by paraphrasing

**17.** The first paragraph of the story that summarizes the story and leads the reader's interest

**18.** Abbreviation for questions that should be answered from the information in any good news story
