

- **8.** Stroke symptoms that go away in less than 24 hours
- **9.** Weakness of one side of the body
- **11.** An interruption of blood flow to the brain that results in a loss of brain function
- 12. Loss of bowel or bladder control
- **13.** A swelling or enlargement of part of an artery resulting from weakness of the arterial wall
- **15.** A lack of oxygen that causes cells to not function properly

- 1. Low blood glucose levels
- 2. A period following a seizure that typically includes labored respirations and altered mental status.
- **3.** Experiencing a warning sense prior to an event
- **4.** Controls basic functions of the body, such as breathing and blood pressure
- **5.** A surge of electrical activity in the brain, classified as generalized, partial, or status epilepticus
- **6.** Part of the brain located above the cerebellum; divided into right and left hemispheres
- 7. An inability to produce or understand speech
- 10. Controls muscle and body coordination
- **14.** A seizure lasting longer than 30 minutes or multiple shorter, repetitive seizure episodes in rapid succession
